Background on the Presenters

Adam Rogers is Emerging Technology Services Librarian, NCSU Libraries. He is an innovative and user-focused librarian who works at the intersection of public services and new technologies. In his role as Emerging Technology Services Librarian, he planned for, launched, and currently manages the NCSU Libraries' Makerspace program. With colleagues, he was awarded the 2012 ACRL Innovation in College Librarianship Award, and in 2015 he was named a Library Journal Mover & Shaker. 3D printing has generated a lot of excitement in the library world, and it has a lot to offer the students and faculty we serve. The NCSU Libraries offers a 3D printing service at the James B. Hunt Jr. Library and gives students hands-on access to 3D printers in the new D.H. Hill Library Makerspace. I'll discuss these two service models and share examples of user projects, course integrations, and more. I'll also demo and share resources for those interested in exploring 3D printing, 3D design, 3D scanning, and other makerspace tools

Tiwanna S. Nevels is the Director of Library Services for The Prezell R. Robinson Library. Ms. Nevels received a Bachelor of Science degree in organizational management from SAU in 2007. She also received a Master of Library Science degree from North Carolina Central University in 2009 as a Diversity Scholar. The central theme Library as Place, gave way to an opportunity for Ms. Nevels to reexamine the roles, spaces and services in libraries. Although her focus was academic librarianship. Ms. Nevels brings to this position a profound knowledge of libraries, with a deep passion for scholarly research, and a keen understanding of the centrality of libraries in today's colleges and universities. She is a member of the American Library Association (ALA) and a host of associations that speak to the enhancement of library services to everyone.

Rob Ross is the Executive Director of NC LIVE. Rob joined NC LIVE from OCLC, a global library cooperative, where he most recently served in a leadership role as Director of Implementation Programs. At OCLC, Ross led the team responsible for working with member libraries of all types to successfully implement new technologies, redesign library workflows and measure ROI. He continuously engaged with libraries to identify their most pressing needs and create services to meet them. He also collaborated with libraries to tell their stories publicly at conferences and in publications. Today Rob We brings the leadership NC LIVE needs to continue to strengthen resources and services for NC libraries.

Tom Brennan Is responsible for Wake Tech Community College's Emergency Preparedness Program and is assistant director of Wake Tech's Department of Environmental Health and Safety. He started as a Plantation, FL police officer where he established a community outreach center and taught classes in safety. He moved to North Carolina in 2004 to become a Training/Operations Manager for US Security Associates, where he trained 100+ security officers including those at Wake Tech. In 2010, shortly after Wake Tech developed its own Police Department, he was hired by Wake Tech as a security manager where he did training and coursework on emergency response.

Christ Tonelli is Director of Communication Strategy for the NCSU Libraries. He leads the communications team in enhancing awareness of the Libraries' services, collections, spaces, staff and their accomplishments. Outside of the Libraries, he co-owns So & So Books in downtown Raleigh and is a founding editor of the independent poetry press Birds, LLC. He also curates the So & So Series at CAM Raleigh and edits So & So Magazine and is the author of five chapbooks and one full-length collection of poetry, The Trees Around

Starlette Vaught is Assistant Director of Disability Services at Meredith College. Prior to Meredith she worked at Pitt Community College for four years as Director of the Office of Disability Services. She has a BA from East Carolina University and a Master's in Liberal Studies from UNC-Wilmington. She also spent 15 years working as a Recreational Therapist in various clinical and community settings, worked as an Assistive Technology Consultant and Supervisor for the North Carolina Assistive Technology Program- Eastern Regional Centers, and Chaired the Board of Directors for the Disability Advocates and Resource Center of Eastern North Carolina.
