

Information for students at Meredith College wanting to go elsewhere to take courses:

Q: Which colleges and universities are a part of the CRC cross-registration plan?

- Meredith College, NC State University, William Peace University, Saint Augustine's University, Shaw University and Wake Technical Community College. See details for each institution to the right.

Q: How do I start the process to cross-register for a course at another CRC college or university?

- Obtain a CRC form from the office of the Meredith Registrar or the Registrars website, fill in all information and obtain the necessary signatures.

Q: Which people at my home college/university need to approve my registering for a course through CRC cross-registration?

- Faculty Advisor and Department Head (If department head is unavailable, their signature can be waived with the signature of the School Dean).

Q: Can I take care of cross-registration from my home campus or online or do I need to go to the other campus to register?

- You cannot complete the CRC request via internet; however, once you complete the paperwork at your home institution, the Registrar's Office will forward it to the visiting institution.

Q: Is there a limit to the number of CRC cross-registration courses I can take per semester or a total for my college career?

- A student may take up to three courses per year during the fall and spring semesters. This information can also be found in our undergraduate catalogue (pg. 41).

Q: How will I find out if I am enrolled successfully in a course at another CRC college or university?

- Students will be notified via email by the visiting institution.

Q: How do I drop a course at another CRC college or university?

- Students will need to provide written notification of their desire to drop a course to Meredith College. This can be in the form of an email, or completing a drop/add form. The visiting institution will then be asked to remove the student from the course.
- Meredith College students follow the visiting institution's drop/add and withdrawal dates.

Q: How many hours do I have to take per semester at my home college or university to be considered full-time and therefore eligible for CRC cross-registration?

- Students' semester hours must total 12 or more between the home and visiting institution.

Q: Do I pay anything extra for cross-registering for a course at another CRC college or university?

- Students will not be charged an additional tuition fee; however, any special fee (i.e. lab fee, sports fee etc.) will be billed to the student by the visiting institution.

Q: Can I take courses through CRC cross-registration during summer terms?

- No. CRC is not applicable for summer courses.

Q: Can registering for a course at a CRC college or university affect my financial aid?

- No.

Q: Is there any public transportation that will help me get to the other CRC campuses?

- The Wolfline runs between Meredith and NCSU. The CAT is available for all other colleges and/or universities.
