Goals Recommendations to the Board of Directors

March 13, 2009

- Continue working on joint appointments and trailing spouses
 - Get deans and department heads more involved
 - Realize the economic climate may make this a little harder
- Explore joint appointments for administrative and staff positions
 - (Examples: student activities, advising, HR, IT, library staffs, security, counseling)
- New strong emphasis on helping to fill under-enrolled courses
 - Work with registrars and deans
 - Create a CRC committee and a number of activities to inform and engage academic advising leaders
 - Use the new web site to help get the word out about courses that should draw students from other campuses.
 - Put extra effort into working on foreign languages—start with a committee of those department heads
- Study abroad—report on first meeting:
 - Already one collaboration (May 19-June 22, China program with NC State and St. Augustine's)
 - Consider a meeting in late fall about international opportunities
 - Play up programs on the web site
- Web site—stress use for students and faculty and staff—not so much outside marketing
- Consider a student leadership conference to involve students in CRC
- Check into “assurance of quality” issues for SACS.
