		Discuss ways to determine styles of thought processing & personality types: discerning information from small-scale exercises (examining an individual's determination, perseverance, creativity, collaboration, willingness to ask questions, etc.). Exercises are encouraged for use with existing team members & new hire candidates. 	Room 8A	An extension cord reaches appliances that are distant from power sources and funnels electricity that those appliances would normally not have the proximity to reach. Extension Cord Leadership is the idea that "Leadership" is deeper than just "influence", but it is about the empowerment of those who are being led. It allows for delegation to be less task-oriented, but more mission-oriented. Just like an extension cord, leaders will learn the importance of being "insulated", "flexible", and "wired", with a plug on one end and an outlet at the other end. Also, Extension Cord leaders will learn how to think "inside of their cord", the importance of carrying an influence greater than their own egos, as well as recognizing that real leaders are the plug and not the outlet. It is a creative way to approach and to conceptualize servant leadership. It is less about method and more about mentality.
